




## Why Waterbloc?

# waterproofing indoors

**Q: How much will a watertight room cost?**

**A:** Every job is bespoke and priced individually. A quote is based on a cost per sq meter. Call your local installer for a free quote.

**Q: How long will the installation take?**

**A:** Each job varies depending on it's size however as a guide most rooms can be sealed within a day.

**Q: What state should the room be in?**

**A:** The room should be dry, free of dirt and dust and be as empty as possible.

**Q: Does your work carry any guarantees?**

**A:** Yes, everything we install is protected by our guarantee plus our own company guarantee. If you wish to see our guarantee in detail please ask, we'll be happy to talk you through it.

**Q: How long does the material take to dry?**

**A:** Waterbloc GRP is water repellent after one hour from fitting. You should leave 24 hours before tiling.

**Q: I'd like you to make my room watertight, what should I do next?**

**A:** Congratulations, you've made a good choice. All you have to do is ring your local installer (see below) below and they'll arrange a suitable time to come and give your property a survey, then the installation will be booked in at a time that's convenient with you.
